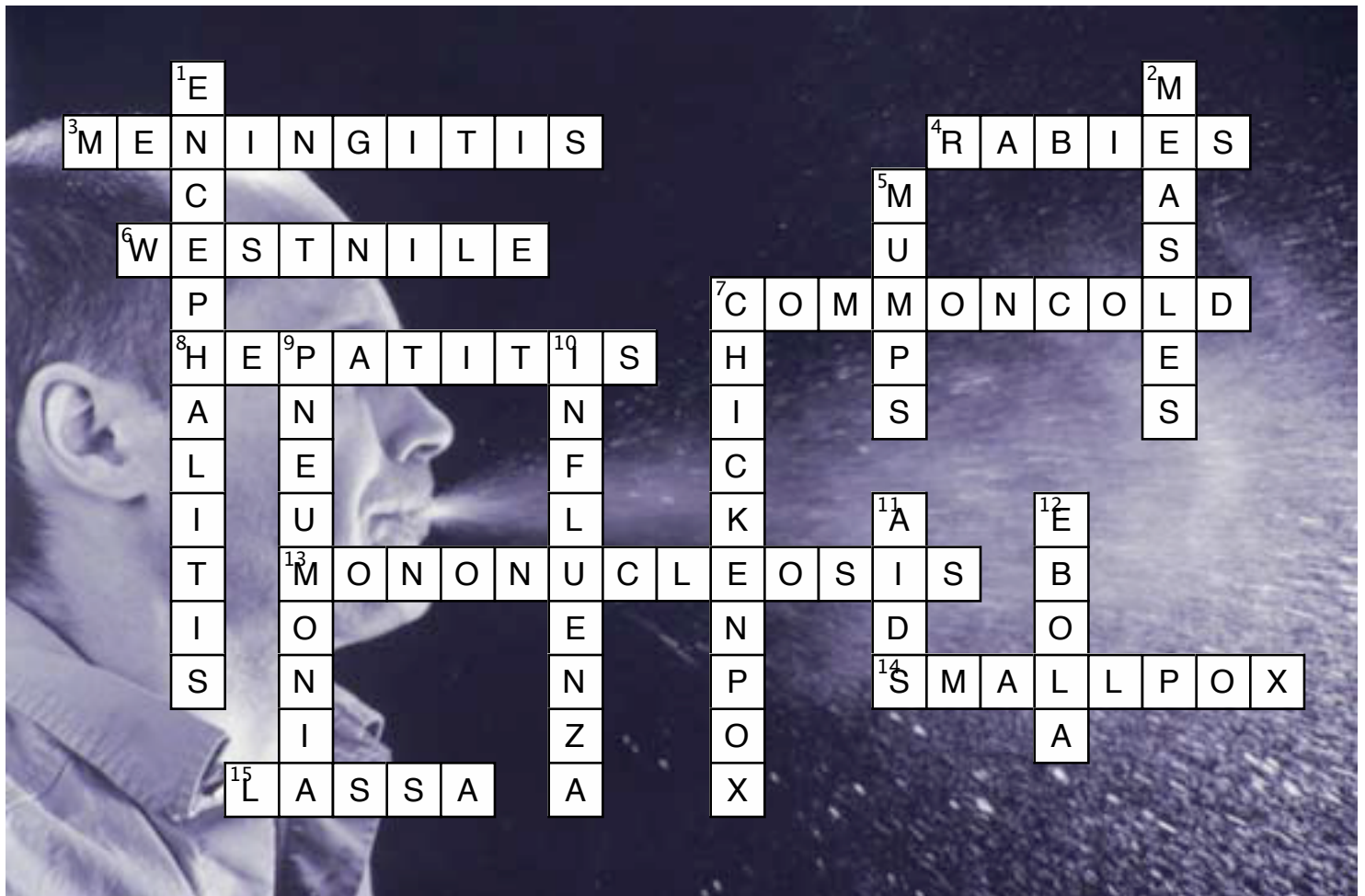


Viral Infectious Diseases

3. An inflammation of the protective membranes covering the central nervous system [MENINGITIS]
4. A viral zoonotic disease that causes acute encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) in mammals. [RABIES]
6. A virus of the family Flaviviridae; part of the Japanese encephalitis (JE) antigenic complex of viruses, it is found in both tropical and temperate regions. Mainly infects birds, but is known to infect humans [WESTNILE]
7. Acute viral nasopharyngitis [COMMONCOLD]
8. Implies injury to liver characterised by presence of inflammatory cells in the liver tissue. [HEPATITIS]
13. Kissing Disease. A disease seen most commonly in adolescents and young adults, characterized in teenagers by fever, sore throat, muscle soreness, and fatigue [MONONUCLEOSIS]
14. Variola or Variola vera. Is a highly contagious disease unique to humans. [SMALLPOX]

1. An acute inflammation of the brain, commonly caused by a viral infection [ENCEPHALITIS]
2. Rubeola. A disease caused by a virus, specifically a paramyxovirus of the genus Morbillivirus. [MEASLES]
5. Epidemic parotitis. A common childhood disease worldwide, and is still a significant threat to health in the third world. [MUMPS]
7. The common name for Varicella zoster, classically one of the childhood infectious diseases caught and survived by almost every child. [CHICKENPOX]
9. An illness of the lungs and respiratory system in which the alveoli become inflamed and flooded with fluid. [PNEUMONIA]
10. An infectious disease of birds and mammals caused by an RNA virus of the family Orthomyxoviridae (the influenza viruses) [INFLUENZA]

15. A fever that is an acute viral hemorrhagic fever first described in 1969 in a Nigerian town of the same name in the Yedseram River valley [LASSA]

11. A collection of symptoms and infections resulting from the specific damage to the immune system.

12. A group of viruses belonging to genus Ebolavirus, family Filoviridae, and the common name for the disease which they cause. [EBOLA]
